Language:

We have been working on our "Daily 5" centres while I meet with individuals/small groups to assess and teach reading. We learned how to write a procedure and have had the opportunity to practice narrative story writing with spooky stories. Now, we are learning how to write a paragraph with a main idea, three supporting details and a conclusion.

Math:

We have just finished our number sense unit on place value, rounding, number patterns and addition and subtraction. We are moving on to a unit on linear measurement, time and temperature. Students also work on graphing and data management during our science and social studies units.

Science/Social Studies:

In Science, we are studying Structures through a series of hands-on centres. In Social Studies, we are learning about the physical land regions within Ontario (Canadian Shield, St. Lawrence Lowlands, Hudson Bay Lowlands).

Conferences and Progress Reports:

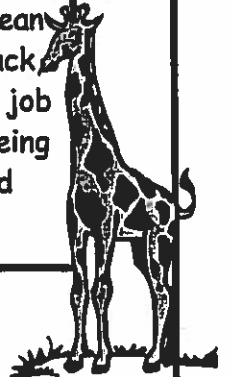
